NEWS FROM THE MAROLF'S



Yes, miracles still happen!


This news was too great not to shout from the rooftops. Praise God for his tender mercies as well as His greatness. Thanks for listening.

RECIPES FOR SUMMER

CRUNCHY CHICKEN SALAD

2 Chicken breast halves, skinless & boneless
 ½ cup prepared bottled marinade (ginger-sesame or sweet and sour work well)
 ¼ cup slivered almonds
 ½ cup mandarin oranges (chopped)
 ¼ cup water chestnuts, sliced or 1 stalk celery, chopped
 1 cup fat-free lemon yogurt
 1 tablespoon lemon juice
 1 Pkg. salad greens
 Spoon marinade over chicken and allow to sit for 10 minutes. Wrap chicken in foil and grill for 7 minutes. Make sure the chicken is cooked thoroughly. Cool and chop in bite-size pieces. Combine all ingredients, stirring to blend. Spoon ¼ of mixture over salad greens. Garnish with croutons or additional freshly sliced fruit (Optional). Add a light Asian salad dressing if desired.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

BEER IS NOT JUST FOR DRINKING

Cooks often use wine in their sauces, but beer helps make a great batter. Try this recipe for

Beer-battered fish

1 ½ cups of your favorite pale ale, flattened to remove the carbonation
 2 cups flour 2 eggs, beaten
 1 teaspoon pepper 1 teaspoon onion powder
 ¼ teaspoon turmeric 2 pounds fillet of cod
 Oil for deep-frying

Mix the flour, pepper, onion powder and turmeric. Add the beer and egg, mixing only enough to moisten the dry ingredients. If the batter is too thin, add more flour: if it's too thick, you're in luck,..... time to add more beer. Slice the fillets into several strips and coat them in flour before dipping them in the batter. Once coated, place the strips in a deep fryer or a heavily oiled skillet and fry. Cook until they're golden, turning occasionally. Remove the fish from the oil, and drain on paper towels, Serve immediately.
